Hacking Cough



Case: F/16, Miss Ellen, dry hacking cough

Doctor: What brought you here Ellen? Patient: (Coughing) I'm so sorry. **Doctor:** How long have you been coughing? Patient: It's been three months already. **Doctor:** So it got worse recently? **Patient:** Yes doctor. **Doctor:** Do you notice some phlegm? Patient: No. **Doctor:** Is the cough there all the time? Or it's on and off? **Patient:** It's been here all the time. **Doctor:** Is there any thing that makes your cough worse? Like positional changes? Seasonal changes? After eating? Patient: Positional changes like lying down makes me cough even worse. **Doctor:** Is there anything that makes your cough better? Have you taken any medication? Patient: I took some cough medication. **Doctor:** So do you have any other symptoms besides a cough? Any fever? Chills? Night sweats? Patient: I have had on and off fever. **Doctor:** Have you noticed any changes in your weight? Any changes in you appetite? Any changes in your bowel habits? **Patient:** I've lost weight, though my appetite seemed normal and my bowel habits are regular. **Doctor:** Have you experienced shortness of breath? Have you felt any chest pain? Patient: Yes, there were times when felt like I was catching my breath and I also experienced chest pain sometimes. **Doctor:** Have you ever had wheezing? Headaches? Runny nose? Sore throat? Postnasal drip? Patient: Yes, I have had postnasal drip.

Doctor: Have you ever had Asthma? Gastric acid problems? Allergic rhinitis? Drug allergies? Any heart problems?

Patient: No, I haven't had any of those.

Patient: Actually, I work at the day care center and the kids are always sick. **Doctor:** Do they have the same cough as you do? A cough without phlegm? Patient: Some kids cough with phlegm but some also have none. **Doctor:** Is there anybody who has had tuberculosis around you? Patient: No doctor. **Doctor:** Is there anybody in your family having other disease such as diabetes? Heart problems? High blood pressure? Patient: My father has high blood pressure. **Doctor:** Now I'd like to ask some personal questions which can be helpful for me to figure this out better. Is it okay with you? Patient: No problem doctor. **Doctor:** So how long have you worked in the day care center? Patient: About a year doctor. **Doctor:** Do you drink? Do you smoke? Do you use any illegal drugs? Patient: I drink occasionally but I haven't tried smoking and using illegal drugs. **Doctor:** Now, I'd like to ask you about your sexual life. I know this is very private. But sometimes this can give us a big hint. Will you not mind? **Patient:** Not at all, I am open for those questions as long as it can help figure out my problem. Doctor: Okay, are you sexually active? If so; how many partners do you have? Do you use protections?

Patient: No doctor, I'm not sexually active.

Doctor: Where are you originally from?

In the meantime, I will give your medication to ease your cough. Do you have any questions?

Patient: I work at a day care center. Is this the reason why I have a cough?

Doctor: It might.

Patient: Do I need antibiotics to get better?

Doctor: Maybe. It depends on what you really have though. If it is pneumonia, they help. But for others, they do not.

Patient: Okay doctor, thank you so much for your time.

Doctor: Welcome. See you soon.
