Shopping

Useful Phrases:

- Can I help you? / May I help you? / How may I help you?
- No, thanks. I'm just looking around. / No, thank you. I'm just looking around.
- Excuse me. Could you help me? / Could you show me some (things you'd like to buy), please?
- I'd like to buy (things you'd like to buy). / I'm looking for (things you'd like to buy).
- What clothes size do you wear? / What is your size?
- I wear clothes in size (your clothes size number). / I wear size (your size clothes: small (S), medium (M), large (L), extra-large (XL(and so on)
- What shoe size do you wear?
- I wear size (your shoe size number)

- Can I try it on? / Where can I try it on?
- Do you think it fits me?
- I'm afraid the (thing you tried putting on) is (too small / too big) for me.
- I'd like the same in (size you've chosen / color you've chosen).
- How much is it? /How much does it cost?
- Can you show me something less expensive?
- I'll take it. / I'll buy it.
- I'll pay it by (cash / credit card).
- Could you give me the receipt, please?

Conversation

Instruction: Read the dialogue carefully twice. First reading: Waiter – teacher, A – student. Second reading: Waiter – student, A – teacher.

- A : Welcome! Can I help you?
- B : No, thanks. I'm just looking around.
- A : I see. Please tell me then if there's anything you need.
- B : Sure. But I guess I know what I need now. Could you help me find a souvenir for my best friend?
- A : What souvenir would you like to give to your best friend?
- B : Could you show me some souvenir shirts, please?
- A : This way ma'am.
- B : These are great! I'd like to buy this one.
- A : What clothes size will you buy?
- B : My best friend and I wear the same clothes size. I wear size medium.
- A : Here it is ma'am.
- B : Can I try it on?
- A : Yes, you can.
- B : Where can I try it on?

A : Our fitting room is behind the checkout counter ma'am.
B : Thank you so much for the help.
A : You're welcome.

(After fitting the souvenir shirt.)

B : Do you think it fits me? I'm afraid the souvenir shirt is too big for me.
A : No ma'am. The souvenir shirt fits you well.
B : Oh! Great! Thank you. I'd like the same souvenir shirt but in color blue, please. My best friend likes the color blue so much.
A : Here it is ma'am. Is there anything else I can help you ma'am?
B : I guess this is only what I need. How much does this cost?
A : It is only \$30 ma'am.
B : Can you show me something less expensive?
A : I'm sorry ma'am but all our souvenir shirts have the same price.
B : I see. Thank you so much.
A : You're welcome.

(At the checkout counter.)

Cashier : Good afternoon. Is this all ma'am?
B : Yes, please.
Cashier : \$30 ma'am.
B : I'll pay it by cash. Here is my \$30. Could you give me a receipt?
Cashier : We will surely give your receipt ma'am. Here is what you've purchased and your receipt ma'am.
B : Thank you.
Cashier : You're welcome. Please come again.
